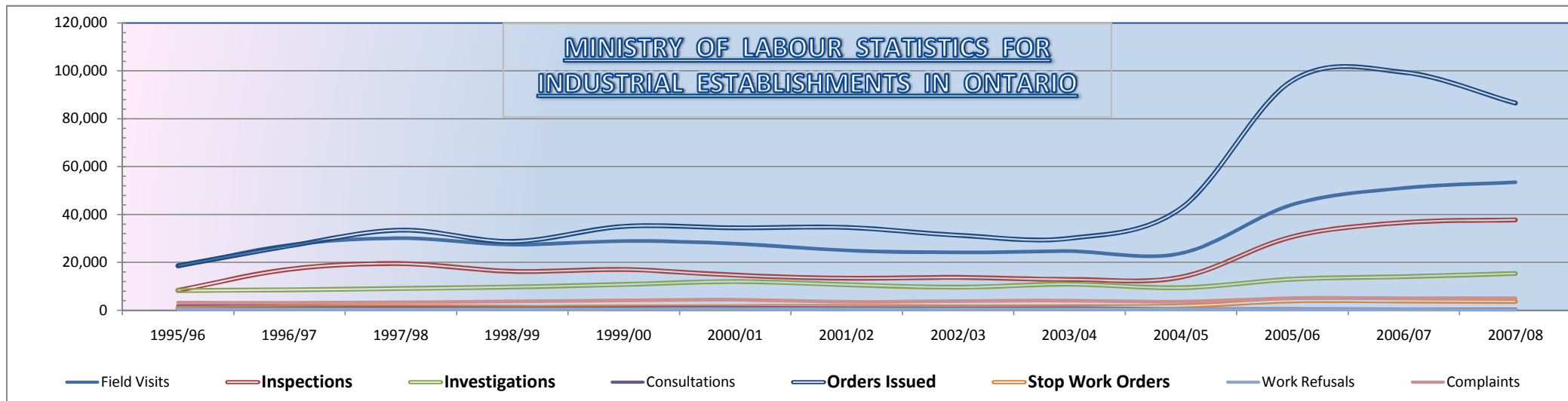

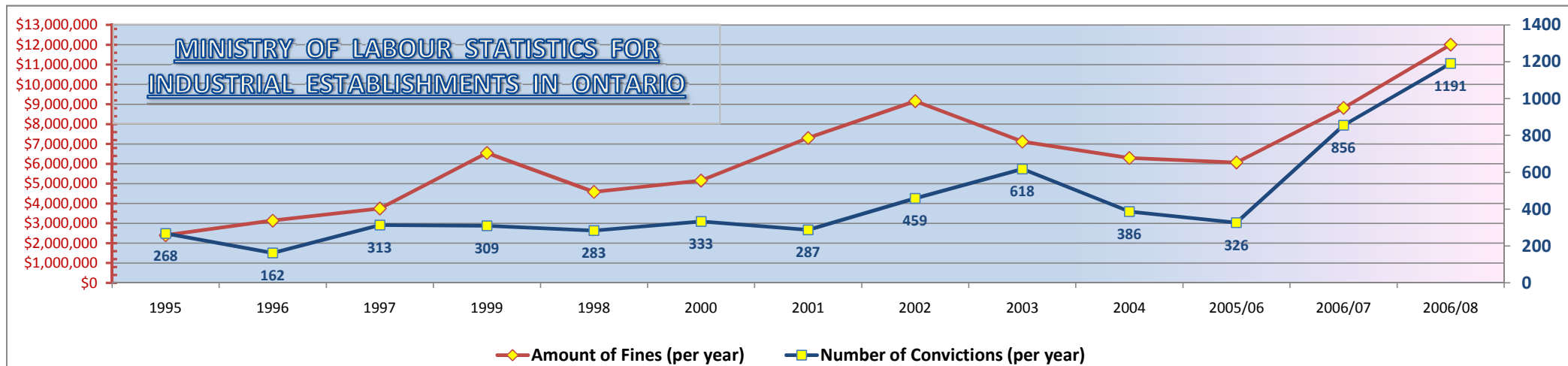

### Work-Related Deaths as Reported by Ministry of Labour (MOL) and WSIB

The following chart lists deaths caused by traumatic injuries and other immediate causes on an annual basis as reported by both the MOL and the WSIB. In the Deaths investigated by the **Ministry of Labour** include deaths of workers from traumatic injuries and other immediate causes. The MOL does not investigate Deaths reported by the **WSIB** include deaths of workers from traumatic injuries or other immediate causes whose employers have coverage under the WSIA. **Both** refers to deaths investigated by the MOL where the worker also has WSIB coverage. The total below has been adjusted to take this into account. Immediate causes include such things as infectious diseases and chemical toxicity.
